From the Priest-in-charge

All my life I have been lucky enough first to be taken to church, and then, when old enough, to be able to go to church of my own accord. I was therefore glad to read some words of Canon Giles Fraser which express something of what is special about going to church. 'Churches, like live theatre', he wrote, 'cannot be successfully replicated online. Churchgoing is about the solidarity of sitting in the same pew, being involved in the same liturgy, trying to get on with people with whom you don't have anything else in common. We have survived every conceivable war, crisis, scandal, collapse and disillusionment. OK, we may not have the money to keep the heating on all the time. But don't expect the "for sale" sign to go up any time soon'.

It is heralded well ahead in the streets, but in the end Christmas, the birth-day of Christ, always seems to come suddenly. This is likewise characteristic of the coming of Christ as presented in the gospel. Watch, for you know not when he comes (Mark 13.35-7) is the message of Advent. Christmas with its sudden arrival is a true sacrament or sign of the coming of Christ. He was born as blessed Mary's child when the fulness of the time had indeed come, but the arrangements for his arrival were not ready. He is given also to dwell in our hearts through faith as king of peace, the peace and love of God. It falls out well that my last

letter as priest-in-charge can end with words which, like the gospel itself, can be understood by all, but hold within them all the mystery and joy of the Christian religion: HAPPY CHRISTMAS.
