

From the Priest in Charge

Dear Friends

During the past few years, the period between Ascension Day (30th May) and Whitsun or Pentecost (9th June) has been marked by a call to prayer under the banner of **Thy Kingdom Come.** The initiative came from the Archbishops of Canterbury and York but has grown into an international and ecumenical phenomenon.

After the very first Ascension Day, the disciples gathered with the Blessed Virgin Mary, constantly devoting themselves to prayer while they waited for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Like them, our reliance on the gift of the Holy Spirit is total – on our own we can do nothing.

It is hoped that everyone will commit to pray each day to

- Deepen their relationship with Jesus Christ
- Ask for God's spirit to work in the lives of those they know
- In so doing, come to realise that every aspect of their life can be the subject of prayer.

Our prayer is that the Holy Spirit will inspire and equip us to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with our friends and families, our communities and networks. We pray especially that those who have not yet heard the Good News of Jesus Christ and His love for the world will hear it for themselves and respond and follow Him.

Specifically, we pray that God's Spirit might work in the lives of 5 people we know by name who have not responded with their 'Yes' to God's call.

The Archbishop of Canterbury rather "cheekily" (his word) asked Pope Francis at a recent meeting for a message of encouragement, which he recorded on his mobile phone. Here is a transcript of what he said:

"Come Holy Spirit. This is the cry of all Christians [on this day of Pentecost]. Come Holy Spirit – the promise of the Father; the promise of Jesus. That the Holy Spirit might enlarge and widen our hearts.

We all have a problem that our hearts tend to shrink. Become smaller and closed. We cannot solve that problem by ourselves. Only the Holy Spirit can solve it.

And to Jesus, thy kingdom come. The kingdom of the Father you came to announce. And to you, my brothers and sisters, with my brother Justin Welby, we want to tell you that we walk alongside you in this prayer" – **Thy Kingdom Come.**

The Holy Spirit works through our praying, not always how we expect, but always to bring new birth, including surprised people of every kind. Let our prayer for 5 people be that Jesus Christ may become for them a world changing, life changing reality and so may Thy Kingdom Come.

Walsingham – Saturday 3rd August

I am taking a group to the Anglican Shrine at Walsingham on Saturday 3rd August. There will be a coach leaving the Trumpington Park and Ride at 9am, returning by 7pm. The cost is £20.

There will be a full programme of services during the day, but also the opportunity to mix and match these with the possibilities of enjoying the lovely Shrine grounds and exploring this ancient village, with its ruined abbey and priory, set deep in the heart of the North Norfolk countryside.

Along with Canterbury, Walsingham was once a major pilgrimage centre in Europe, visited regularly by monarchs, up to (and initially including) Henry the Eighth. The Shrine was restored in the 1920s and once again it functions as an international pilgrimage centre dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, who shows us by her life and example of obedience, humility and love, the way to her son, Our Lord Jesus Christ. The prayer of the pilgrim is:

So as now we journey, aid our week endeavour. Till we gaze on Jesus and rejoice for ever.
